A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Gospel John 1:35-42

They saw where he lived, and stayed with him. As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus

The Homily

The Profession of Faith

who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins

and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.
