Understanding the long-term impact of Covid and its aftermath on the Church will take many years. Here at St Margarets an initial assessment shows that the former congregation has shrunk by about 33%, though some parishioners are still rightly shielding. Despite this fall in numbers, many new parishioners have recently moved into the neighbourhood and have made themselves known to the Parish welcome team over recent months. The face of the Parish is evolving slowly.

The numbers returning and the arrival of new parishioners are grounds for hope. My aim is to sustain this collective hope for the future life of the Parish. Our last fundraising campaign, excluding seeking funds for the refurbishment of the Hall and its facilities, took place nearly five years ago. Emerging out of lockdown and the long aftermath of Covid restrictions is the opportunity, may I suggest, to renew our engagement with the parish and review our regular giving. This follows naturally from our Reboot weekend in mid-October.

This parish sustains a regular liturgical, spiritual, catechetical, pastoral outreach and community life which all require effective administration and well-maintained physical spaces for these activities to take place in safety and comfort. All the funds raised here at St Margarets are used to advance the mission of the Church and to nurture this community of faith. As a visible society the Church, as existing in its living parishes, needs your support to operate and offer the saving message of Jesus Christ to the community, and beyond into the wider world.

Thank you for reflecting on your commitment to the mission of this Parish.

Is my offering planned, prayerful & proportionate?

The Bible tells us to return a tithe to God, traditionally defined as 10% of our income – otherwise known as 'proportionate giving'. The contemporary definition for a tithe is to give "5 & 5":

- 5% of your income to charity (including your parish!).
- 5 hours a month of your time volunteering
