Fr Peter writes:

Nearly every week I say an early morning Mass for one class at St Richard Reynolds. This year the cycle is beginning with Year 11, GCSE year. There did not seem much enthusiasm but I would expect nothing less! Other than fulfilling the timetabling requirement and to provide material for a Section 48 inspection for a Catholic school, why would I bother celebrating Mass. There is something in the celebration of the Liturgy that cannot be communicated in any other way, and the dynamic can touch the most disinterested and antagonistic selves. Jesus' great acts, his teaching, his miracles, his healings are distilled into a sustained action in time and space, the ritual of Mass, and his acts does not remain mere words or memories alone. Liturgy engages us beyond the passing thoughts of the mind, and variable sentiments of the heart. Every participant is entering a drama, of ultimately, cosmic proportions, the conquest over death and the access to eternal life.

Every culture since the dawn of time has recreated its history and its aspirations, in some form of ritual, so in the world of British sport it is; tea and cricket; pimms and croquet, rugby and beer, football and lager. Other countries have national days, normally celebrations that mark the overthrow of ancient regimes. Only in Northern Ireland is the defeat of James II celebrated amongst the Protestant community. Elsewhere in Britain national holidays do not take on this nationalistic flavour, nor of any workers revolution. When the Labour government instituted the May Day Bank Holiday in the 1970s, any thought of it being the celebrations of workers' rights, for better or worse, soon evaporated. Our secular liturgies are more sport or family. The funeral of Queen Elizabeth being the most notable exception.

Back to Mass, the two poles of life, journey and homecoming, are brought together. The staple of timeless ritual discovers a deeper unity in the person of Jesus Christ who was both given to the world to undertake the journey of public life, the contents of the Gospel, and return to the Father, having conquered sin and death, his true home.

Journey and homecoming are fecund images of our human condition, and they take particular shape in each of our lives. All of us have a story to tell about our own

life's journey. Each of us possesses a deeply held attachment to home and all the customs attached with that reality. There is though only one journey of life and there is ultimately only one eternal home. This is not always obvious submerged in the flux of daily life and the strident culture that marks modern life. The Mass makes sense of this flux, and just for an hour a week, every participant can enter another zone.

To see life as a journey, however fragmented it may seem at any one time, is to begin to discover God, who both makes the journey possible and who Himself becomes the final destination, the ultimate desire of humanity. To discover God does not entail rejecting all other desires whether of happiness, love, friendship, belonging. Instead belief in God brings order to what would otherwise be inchoate, unattainable and contradictory goals.

The Christian takes further steps. God does not simply bring order into our jumbled-up desires, He intervenes through His Son Jesus Christ who out of love for us, and being one of us, brings healing to the confusion and fragmentation that marks every human life. To see one's own life in fragments, whether good parts, indifferent parts or bad parts, is implicitly to recognise life should be a whole, and as whole possess meaning and be orientated to an ultimate destination. Belief in Jesus Christ does not come from personal success but from relative failure.

Thus, the Mass potentially is for everyone, even if receiving Holy Communion, is an expression of true communion might not always be appropriate as when the fragmentation of life turns into serious sin. Another sacrament, that of Reconciliation, becomes necessary. Participation in Mass will always restore and make sense of life, now in fragments and as one seamless whole for eternity.
