In Peter writes:

Last month Pope Francis initiated a worldwide 'Synodal Pathway', a global exercise in listening within the Church. The Church is entering new waters. Since the Second Vatican Council Popes have called numerous synods dedicated to a particular subject such as the vocation of the laity, the place of marriage, the ministry to youth to name but a few. This forthcoming Synod, does not have any particular title, but concerns the broader concern of how to become the listening Church, of listening and moving forward together. To many such an intention sounds too nebulous, fixated as we are on finding solutions to particular problems. Such specific questions might be, in our own context here at St Margarets, running children liturgy, the parish sacramental programmes, ministry to young people, pastoral outreach to the housebound. These are valid questions that must be answered. However, behind such questions lies something deeper, the reason why these activities should be organised in the first place, and what is the ethos being nurtured by such endeavours.

Pope Francis is inviting us to step back from those practical questions and to listen to the experience of faith that each of us possess that will form the material of journeying together. By force of circumstances the pandemic has made parishes rethink their mission, whether it be livestreaming Mass, zoom catechesis, mission drops to the housebound. Strangely Covid-19 has ignited a burst of creativity within many parishes. The Synodal Pathway aims to capture the essence of that creativity and understanding why it produced such good fruit. The past brought us to this place but the situation was new and the past gave little clue as to the present.

Now the aim of this Synodal Pathway, of seeing how every parish community can listen to each other's experience of faith, and of finding new ways of being a living community. During lockdown a large number of new families and people have joined the parish. It is almost as if the new way of being a parish, forced upon us by the pandemic, is already bearing fruit. The face of the parish is changing whilst remaining the same parish of St Margarets.

Within the first few months of arriving in summer 2016 I organised a number of house meetings in order to meet small groups of parishioners to discuss their experiences and listen to their hopes and frustrations. It was a very helpful exercise as it made it possible to meet a nunmerous parishioners quite quickly and assess the parish landscape. This synodal pathway follows a similar pattern but because of Covid, I do not think it appro-

priate to meet in parishioners' houses, so wish to offer the possibility of meeting here in our newly refurbished hall on a few different occasions.

These sessions will be exercises in listening to each other, to our current real experience of our faith and church. Everyone wants the parish to be better in some undefined way, but that is not the point of this exercise. The fundamental question becomes, *how is our journeying together as the Church happening today in our parish? What steps does the spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together?*

To give flesh to our answers and help us discern, the Diocese invites us to reflect on what has our experience taught us as to what we mean by my 'Church', who is included, who is missing; what is the Holy Spirit saying to us now, and what steps is the Spirit inviting us to undertake to make our community more welcoming, inclusive and missionary?

My suggestion is that those who wish to engage in this listening process meet on **one** of three possible meetings; **Saturday 13th or 20th November 11:00am 12:30pm or Tuesday 23rd November 7:00pm to 8:30pm**.

Please could we all say the Synod Prayer that this listening exercise will bear fruit We stand before You, Holy Spirit, As we gather together in Your name. With you alone to guide us, *Make Yourself at home in our hearts;* Teach us the way we must go And how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; Do not let us promote disorder, Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path Nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity So that we may journey together to eternal life And not stay from the way of truth And what is right. All this we ask of You, Who are at work in every place and time, In the communion of the Father and the Son, Forever and ever. Amen

Small figures of Mary & Joseph will be travelling through Twickenham this Advent. Innkeepers are needed to host them for a night as they continue their journey. Would you like to welcome them into your home? Innkeepers then become pilgrims as they take Mary and Joseph on the next leg of their journey to the next home they will be staying at.

The tradition of the travelling crib is hundreds of years old and originates from Spain and South America where each evening during Advent "Las Posadas" takes place ("posada" means inn or lodging). Pilgrims re-enact Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem in preparation for the birth of Jesus, travelling on their journey looking for somewhere to stay for the night.

This is a lovely way to do something spiritual in Advent and enhance your anticipation of Christmas and the excitement of receiving again the new life that comes to us with the birth of the baby Jesus.

Young and not-so young; singles, couples and families can all take part.


