In Peter writes: will finally commence

Tomorrow building work will finally commence with regard to the refurbishment of the Hall, fa-

cilities and basement. This is an exiting project that will help advance the mission of the parish despite the obvious inconveniences that will emerge during the building work itself. The restoration of the lavatories is long overdue and turning the basement into a single space with full disabled access will allow parish groups to meet any night of the week, irrespective of whoever is renting the hall. Thank you to all those of you who have contributed to the fund-raising over the last few years. Your commitment to the future of the parish is gratefully acknowledged and I hope that you will then see your generous contributions being to good use.

The refurbished Hall, basement and facilities will enable the parish to undertake the twin mission set for every Parish by Pope Francis, that of being both a field hospital and village square. Sustaining these twin realities is the liturgy of the Church, the Mass and other sacraments. I am full of hope for the future because the spiritual engine for the parish to become a village square or field hospital is firing at 60%. The numbers attending Mass have been slowly increasing as parishioners become more confident in coming to the parish, and government regulations begin to ease. The good work of the stewards has made the church as safe as possible, and I am very grateful for their continued efforts, because I do not suppose any of us thought we would still be in lockdown measures over a year later from the start.

Cardinal Vincent has asked every Deanery, a cluster of parishes arranged around local authorities, to discuss amongst the priests three points with respect to planning for the post-pandemic era. The three points are Reevaluation and restart; sacramental deepening and embracing the mission anew. These three topics will be discussed at the next Parish Pastoral Council steering group on Wednesday 12th May. Their thoughts will then be communicated through the Page and discussed when we can meet up face to face.

The first task is to reflect whether everything that took place before the pandemic should be restored in the same format or has the time come to initiate new ways of undertaking the parish's mission to make disciples, evangelise the neighbourhood, provide catechetical activities for young and old, and to reflect on those activi-

ties that make for a field hospital and village square.

Making disciples was the key command of the risen Jesus to the apostles after His Resurrection. How this is achieved depends on the person concerned. Some Catholics become disciples through their prayer life, others through the study of the faith, others through social outreach. None of this is possible unless we remain convinced ourselves of the central message of the faith: "Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you." Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium no 164.

The second task becomes possible when the preparation for sacraments becomes the privileged moments to communicate how this basic truth of the message becomes effective in the life of the Christian. Each sacrament communicates the love of Jesus in a particular way; letting Him save you through Baptism; letting Him free you in Reconciliation, letting Him give His life for you in the Eucharist; letting Him strengthen you through the power of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation; and let Him walk by your side in Marriage. Placing the central message at the heart of the sacraments give them their proper context and they become part of our life journey.

This Sunday's Gospel brings together both the basic message of the love of Jesus; 'a man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends', and the path of discipleship, 'I chose you and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last'. The celebration of the sacraments gives the spiritual energy to make this or any parish both a village square and a field hospital. Thus, the natural flow of community life should be encouraged here to blossom forth once again at St Margaret's, as well as the resumption of the field hospital activities such as the Vineyard Lunches and possibly other homeless initiatives

I am under no illusion as to the task ahead, but with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the good will of yourselves we may, together, be able to gather our community once again and open our doors to new parishioners and new ways of fulfilling our missionary mandate.

Refurbishment of the Parish Hall, Facilities and Base-

May I write to impart the good news that the building work has been given permission to proceed by the Finance Office of the Diocese. The builders will arrive on Monday May 10th and with a fair wind conclude on Friday September 3rd.

Please note the following changes for the construction period.

During building works the carpark will be severely restricted so please think of parking on the street instead on Sundays. During the weekday double-parking will not be allowed as the building site needs potential emergency access. Thank you for your consideration.

This is also the moment to thank once again all those who have contributed to the building fund which has reached nearly £130,000 donated and pledged. The financing of the project is divided into the three parts, the fundraising campaign, the partial use of the cash balance in the bank and a loan from the Diocese of £125,000 payable over seven years. The loan will be paid back through additional Hall rentals, some fundraising and regular donations from the existing building fund.

<u>Access to lavatories -</u> There will be no access to the lavatories in the church building. Facilities will be provided on the ground floor of the presbytery. Please alert the stewards if you need to use the lavatories and they will unlock the presbytery for you. We ask that parents accompany their children due to safety issues around crossing the car park.

<u>Sunday 10:30am Mass – overflow seating -</u> There will be no overflow seating available in the hall so numbers at the 10:30 am Mass will be more restricted. Please could everyone wanting to attend the 10:30am Mass book their place in advance (by Saturday evening). If you arrive without having reserved a place, we may need to turn you away.

Alternatively, please consider coming to one of the other Masses which are less busy and there is no need to book. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
