#### THE MOST HOLY TRINITY - 12 JUNE 2022 - Year C

**Fr Peter writtes:** 'Son et Lumiere' used to be the great French summer draw as some mouldy chateau was illuminated with a few spot lights. After last Saturday this is all going to take on another dimension. The closing ceremony at the 2012 Olympics saw an explosion of technology. Last Saturday another stage had been reached. The technological marvels of creating a stellar corgi with bow from synchronised drones will take some beating! Nevertheless, the next national event will probably produce greater marvels still.

The ingenuity of the human spirit can both produce such marvels but at the same time prove immensely destructive as can be seen throughout the world where violence takes hold. As the remit of technology expands so does the possibility of its evil use. Deep inside each person lies a fracture between the possibility of creating good outcomes and realising its opposite. That individual fracture is magnified collectively to create what the Church calls, 'the structures of sin' when the collective memory of what is good, is systematically blotted out. The prophet stands out against these collective failures of memory. Most contemporary prophets are not tortured but ridiculed whether it be Prince Charles on architecture and the environment, Mary Whitehouse on the crude profanities on television, Victoria Gillick on the realities of abortion, JK Rowling on the common sense understanding of womanhood. Prophets work contrary to the unexamined belief that society is forever getting better and moving forward, new ideas to be assumed as eternal verities. Certainly, no one would wish to live in a society without anaesthetic or without powerful treatments for cancer and other illnesses.

This Sunday the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the Christian understanding of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. What has been revealed throughout history from Abraham to Jesus Christ has been shown to originate from the identity of God as Trinity. God spoke through His Spirit, leading eventually to the Holy Spirit descending on Mary and the birth of Jesus. His divine identity, there from conception, revealed itself progressively such that Peter could be asked as to the identity of Jesus, to which he replied, 'You are the Christ'. This anticipatory statement of faith, occurring in the middle of Jesus' public life, was not clearly demonstrated till Jesus rises from the dead, and the Holy Spirit descend upon the apostles at Pentecost.

Last Sunday the Church celebrated Pentecost and now celebrates the Most Holy Trinity, God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Receiving the Holy Spirit brings you and

me into the orbit of God's inner life that has been made known in the life of Jesus Christ. Following Jesus Christ within the Church is to participate in the Trinity.

Recognising God as Trinity brings together two contemporary religious viewpoints, that of the world as created, God's world that needs our care, and the personal relationship with a higher power. The ecological movement and quest for personal meaning taken by themselves lack spiritual depth and the demands for moral conversion. Very quickly conversation dries up about what both mean because of the inherent personal contradictions between the western way of life and care for the planet, and the inability to recognise a coherent personal fallible moral history when talking in vague spiritual terms.

Placing Jesus Christ and His Church between creation and the individual connects both viewpoints which brings depth because Jesus Christ, as Son of God and Son of Man connects both together in Himself. Here stands the Church as the Body of Christ, the People of God and Temple of the Holy Spirit, three images presented to help us understand who we are together. As members of the Church we participate in this middle space here in our church, St Margaret's. The Church is the place therefore to understand the world in its entirety, both its beauty and its degradation through human sin; my live in its individuality with its personal history of grace and sin. The Christian is not asked just to understand but to reflect, question and co-create in the power of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, building a shared culture here at St Margaret's that both animates our spiritual lives and builds a positive community is our response to both Jesus as Christ, and God as Trinity. This will make the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity move from dry theological fact to life giving practice.
