visit to Iraq where he

visited amongst other places the ancient city of Ur, the birthplace of Abraham, father of the three monotheistic faiths, Judaism, Christianity and Islam; the ancient Christian cities on the Nineveh plain, and Erbil, capital of Kurdistan. When in St Joseph's Church in Baghdad he spoke of three key Christian principles for community survival, wisdom, witness and promise, principles that apply here at St Margaret's just as much as in Iraq, even if our living situation is completely different.

When Pope Francis speaks of wisdom, he is not referring to intellectual knowledge divorced from life, but from the lived experience of those insignificant in worldly terms - similar to the wisdom of your grandmother or grandfather, rich in experience derived from the conduct of life. Such wisdom is found perfectly in Jesus whose life was not that of earthly power over others but of love and service. As the Church prepares to celebrate Easter, we remember once again how God's love triumphs over sin and death; Jesus dies on the Cross and rises from the dead. Love triumphs over evil, and love always begins in dialogue. Such wisdom is more necessary than ever in our society since the mouthpieces of contemporary culture are all switched onto maximum volume blocking out any possibility of dialogue.

Wisdom is not encountered through shouting but through giving witness, that is how the Beatitudes becomes anchored in our life; the eight reversals identified by Jesus and which are His own selfportrait. Giving daily witness is not the same as becoming occasional heroes, and it this daily witness, a universally attainable goal which in the Pope's mind changes the world. Daily witness to these eight reversals that are the Beatitudes will change our personal world too.

The world of shouting wants immediate results. It is profoundly impatient, lacking the one quality that St Paul identifies as the mark of true love in the wellknown passage from Corinthians; 'Love is always patient'. Love does not give up in front of adversity, and the Pope commended those Christians in Iraq who remain patient in front of violence and oppression, and who are now trying to rebuild their lives in their ancestral homes.

What makes such behaviour possible are the promises that Jesus makes in the Beatitudes. Those who practice these reversals will be blessed, because God works through our weakness in front of the world, and not despite of our weakness. What God gives will always be greater than what the world takes away, the dynamic of the Cross and Resurrection is at work in every Christian.

Witness, patience and divine promise should mark our own lives too, both individually and collectively. By remaining faithful to Mass in whatever form is appropriate, online or in person; by being patient in front of the seemingly endless Covid-19 regulations and all that this implies; and remaining convinced of God's promises that good will triumph over evil, will all help sustain your and our collective mission here at St Margaret's, as will be the case in every other Parish too.

Parish life will not resume in the same way that is so abruptly concluded a year ago. Some activities will not reappear while new ones will emerge from within the community, true signs of the embeded wisdom of the community. Signs of hope are already emerging in our spiritual spring, on-line faith courses, zoom rosaries, zoom and live-streamed Masses are here to stay, live-streamed funerals for those who cannot travel, both now and in the future, a welcome at the front door for those who come to Sunday Mass in person. Sacramental preparation courses have begun and First Holy Communion course will begin after Easter.

There is much to be hopeful for here at St Margaret's. God delivers on His promises and 'where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst'. Our parish mission will be different. It might be smaller but we recognise that even so, Jesus Christ is in our midst and we can approach the future with confidence.


First Holy Communion Programme 2021
