6th SUNDAY OF EASTER - 14 May 2023- Year A

In Peter writes: This weekend is a weekend of the three sacraments of initiation into the Catholic faith. On Saturday the Parish celebrated the annual First Holy Communion Mass, and on Sunday, baptised and confirmed an adult parishioner, and confirmed one of the Confirmation cohort. Following Mass and coffee, volunteers will be running the regular Vineyard Lunch. Coming a week after two weeks after the Confirmation, and a week after the Coronation BBQ last Sunday, it has been a busy time for St Margarets Parish. This is wonderful to behold, and though it is not possible to maintain this intensity of this additional activity over a long stretch it does demonstrate that there is still life in the Catholic Church. None of these catechetical, social and outreach activities could be undertaken without a large number of volunteers, each inspired by the message of the Gospel and each responding to call of the Church to engage with her mission in St Margarets.

Every time an teenager or adult is baptised or confirmed the about-to-be baptised or confirmed professes their faith, firstly by rejecting satan and all his works, and then by professing faith in God the Father, God the Son, Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit. The candidates publicly accept this statement of Catholic faith and formally recognise the change of status and outlook that Baptism and Confirmation will bring. These changes will take place within personal life; in relationships with family and friends; in understanding the culture of the time; and lastly in missionary engagement with the Church and world. Everyone and everything will now be seen in a different way, now seen with the eyes of Jesus Christ and His Church. Faith brings confidence that one is never fully alone, that Jesus accompanies us in our journey of life. He may well seem absent, but He is always there, as He promised, 'I will be with you till the end of time.' This presence is not just personal but community, and so participation in Mass, public prayer, catechesis, prayer groups all help finding where Jesus is present in our lives today.

Baptism and Confirmation bestow a character outof the recipient that makes them like Jesus Christ himself, because through the minister who was celebrating the sacrament, Christ was acting in the ritual. The water was blessed, the oils were applied and the Scripture readings appropriate to the occasion. Word and rite speak of Jesus Christ and are of Jesus Christ.

The same may be said of Baptism and Confirmation. They too are sacraments of character, of giving the recipient the ability to act as Christ (a Christian). Sacraments do give power without cooperation as they are the actions of Christ, but the power remains dormant unless appropriated through a life that develops the natural potentiality to choose the right course of action and set a path to life.

The Bishops of the Second Vatican Council presented a vision of the connection between sacraments and life as lived, 'Christ left to his followers a pledge of this hope and food for the journey in the sacrament of faith, in which natural elements, the fruits of man's cultivation, are changed into His glorified Body and Blood, as a supper of fellowship and foretaste of the heavenly banquet (Gaudium et Spes no 38). Paul VI emphasised the need to continually explain the relationship between sacraments and life. He saw sacraments without catechesis as depriving the sacraments of their effectiveness.

Providing a solid foundation for offer opportunities to explore the faith must be at the heart of Parish life; or crossing the boundary between knowing it in your head and being able to articulate in a sympathetic environment, as an essential learning tool; of sacramental courses to assist children and teenagers to become to sacramental power; to sustain the culture that gives sense to the sacraments, and become open towards the world.

May I thank all those who have sustained this enterprise over the last year. May it bear much fruit in the years ahead.

Thank you to all those who helped in making this day a great success. Some pictures of the day are as below.












