24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 17th September 2023 - Year A

Fr Peter writes:

It is now over ten years since Pope Francis was elected, the first non-European to elected to the papacy since the early Middle Ages. *Evangelii Gaudium* (The joy of the Gospel) was his first major document and it is the fruit of many years' meditation on and experience of the Church, especially in his native Argentina. Beginning the document with the call to encounter Jesus Christ might well be off-putting at first sight – we might think that we have little interior life of prayer; nor have been to the sacrament of reconciliation for years, maybe never blessed a meal for a while; probably lost track about the nuances between right and wrong in small decisions of life, following unconsciously the activity patterns of everyone else in the headlong fulfilment of life's never-ending obligations.

On offer as a counter-blast to this experience is the simple joy derived from being known by Jesus Christ. In the words of the document, 'of the flicker of light born of our personal certainty, when everything is said and done, we are infinitely loved.' Later the document quotes Pope Benedict XVI 'being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.' Receiving this love which restores our own lives, makes the demand, to share that love with others. By sharing with others we embed our own sense of joy as to the gift of being loved.

These opening paragraphs of *Evangelii Gaudium*, are the inspiration for the forthcoming Bishops' worldwide meeting in Rome with Pope Francis, lay people and religious sisters and brothers. How does the church communicate and sustain this joy in today's world? Since the joy of the Gospel is personal, it can only be communicated by those already imbued with that joy both as individuals and as a community, for us, this parish. Every Christian is invited to be that sign of joy through his or her own life, and collectively through the action of the community, this parish.

Thus, St Margaret's, our parish community, is both the collective response to the joy of already being known by Jesus Christ, and the place to re-remember that joy, to re-animate that joy through the celebration of the sacraments especially the Eucharist.

Perhaps as Catholics we are more used to the formal celebration of sacraments rather than the more evangelical sounding 'meeting with Jesus', but without the meeting with Jesus, faith becomes institutional alone. When the time comes that the

institution no longer serves then practice perishes. Focusing on the joy of meeting, of being loved by Christ, and the Eucharist as -remembering the historic form in which this love was demonstrated, the Last Supper, Cross and Resurrection of Jesus, strengthens faith because it strengthens the joy in our hearts.

With these introductory words from Pope Francis' great document, and with the forthcoming meeting in Rome, I feel that this is the time to re-emphasise the evangelistic vision of this parish. Over the summer some members of the Parish Pastoral Council asked to be relieved of their post after their term of service was completed. Serving the community in this way is never to be a life-sentence, and constant renewal of personnel is essential. I am very grateful for everything achieved over the last four years, a period that included Covid lockdown and long journey afterwards. No Parish is one person's effort.

The Pastoral Council will now need a new chair/secretary, and new members for catechetics/adult faith exploration, and new parish pastoral outreach co-ordinator. If one of these posts appeal and you feel called to serve the church community in this way please contact Fr Peter. The length of service on the Pastoral Council is two-three years, not a life-sentence with no parole! The task is not to do everything in that area, but to animate existing and find new volunteers, whether it be for the homeless lunches, children's liturgy on Sunday, and others too. So many good projects are taking place in the parish already, that you will be helping to steer and encouraging a living organisation with the aim of presenting the face of the church to the world, our local world. Pope Francis asks every parish to renew their ways of doing things to make every activity mission orientated because parishes are the longest existing communities in the church. Over history they have proved supremely adaptable; they survived the onslaught of 19th and 20th century urbanism, changes in governments of every type, and developments in technology and culture. Parishes survive because animated by the Holy Spirit and the charisms of individual members they are, in the words of Pope Francis, 'capable of self-renewal and constant adaptivity.' My hope is that St Margaret's is no different.

The Letter tells the story of a journey to Rome of frontline leaders to discuss Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'*.


The film features an exclusive dialogue with the Pope, offering an exclusive insight into the personal history and stories of our Pope.
