Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A 18<sup>th</sup> October 2020



## *In Peter writes:*

Last Sunday afternoon the Parish celebrated Confirmation for nine teenagers who had been preparing over the year for receiving the sacrament. I was very pleased to see that two had chosen 19th century American saints, Katherine Drexel and Lily of the Mohawks. Katherine Drexel was a member of the banking dynasty but gave up her wealthy life to found a religious order, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. Her mission was to teach native and African Americans. Through her life she established 50 schools for African Americans, and 12 schools for Native Americans. St Kateri Tekawitha (Lily of the Mohawks), after her conversion aged nineteen she moved to Kahnawake, a Christian settlement of native-americans, south west of Montreal, and worked tirelessly for the Church.

These two saints living in the 19th and 16th century respectfully shows how advanced the Church was in comparison to secular society of the time. Indeed, it is only the power of the Gospel that allows for the compassionate transformation of society, of identifying the truly marginalised. Long before 'Me Too' or 'Black Lives Matter', the Church has spoken and acted on the injustices that permeate fallen society. The Church itself is a perfect society even when its members are tainted by sin and human limitation, because the Church is composed of both saints and sinners. The secular world will forever try to minimise the role of religion and claim for itself every aspect of social advance. Recent events have proved this to be a hollow claim. Me Too was a reaction to the acceptable working practices in the creative industries and promotion of sexual liberation. Black Lives Matters erupts after thirty years of attempts at race relations.

The Church recognises that the dynamic of social change comes through personal conversion. Reading the signs of the times in the light of the Gospel and conversion of heart is obvious in the two saints mentioned earlier. It is also obvious in Mother Teresa, seeing the dignity of those left to die in the street; St Pope Paul VI, his personal sanctity and commitment to the Second Vatican Council when so many turned against him for both sides of the ideological divide; and St Pope John Paul II, who could see the dangers of modern life to the sanctity of life, to name a few near contemporaries. To belong to the Church is to belong to a visible society that is at the forefront of social change with regard to the marginalised. The

Church is always ahead of the curve when it comes to civic society.

This Sunday's Gospel on paying tribute to Caesar demonstrates that the Church recognises the validity of civil society, but that in fact everything ultimately belongs to God. The separation of Church and State, the prerequisite of modern societies, is posited on a misunderstanding of this Gospel. The restriction of religion to the private realm allows secular society to legislate on social and sexual issues on which it has no competence. Recent events have shown that civic society with its ability to legislate has shown itself woefully inadequate because democracy without an anchor is simply the tyranny of the majority. All morality must ultimately all stem from God, otherwise it becomes simply current fashion dressed up in whatever philosophical system seems appropriate at the time. Morality also becomes purely transitory, as so much conversations on current social mores has indicated. Listening to so much complaints about our current condition gives the impression that the former eras of our own society were grossly inadequate. No human society is person but however inadequate provided an opening for whatever current fashions exist. The demonising of the past only goes to show the shallow roots of contemporary morality.

On the other hand, the Church can look back at generation of saints who have questioned the culture of the time, stood up for freedom of religion, attended to poor and marginalised, promoted the rights of women, and were instrumental in fostering harmonious relations between different races. It is right to render unto Caesar what belongs to Caesar, but to acknowledge that only God reigns over all. The morality of the Gospel will also be the effective source of change in every society.
