# OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

34TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - 20th NOVEMBER 2022 - Year C

# In Peter writes:

This last year has witnessed the death of Queen Elizabeth II and the country now waits for the coronation of King Charles III. The many years of dedication shown by the Queen contrasts with the high-handedness and petty squabbles of the political and media classes. Her constancy provided an anchor for those who have no wish to live their lives in a constant state of flux, faux indignation and immanent catastrophes. Monarchy in many ways has saved the country from the worst excesses of political and social chaos. It was not always thus. The tone was purposefully set by the Queen herself and within the limitations of human fallibility and weight of tradition, she refashioned the monarchy as the embodiment of stability and common decency.

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King, and this parish celebrates its Patronal Feast Day of St Margaret, Queen of Scotland. An unforeseen convergence of dates but illuminating. Sunday's Gospel, taken from St Luke's Gospel, is the account of Jesus' conversation with the two thieves on the Cross. One of the two criminals, recognises that Jesus had done nothing wrong, unlike either of them, and intuiting something about Jesus asks for forgiveness. Mercy is a fundamental facet of Jesus' kingship and had been aa constant feature of His public life.

Reflecting on the mercy offered by Jesus throughout His life, demonstrates someone in complete control of Himself and so His actions, words and insights are completed orientated to the other. Kingship with regard to Jesus Christ is both supernatural, of cosmic proportions, but also of intensely human proportions, the mastery of self. Exercising His Kingship sits with His care with those He encountered.

Here lies the lesson for ourselves, mastery of self is liberation to serve others. Kingship in Christ's image is the commission to serve. St Margaret, our Patron saint, demonstrated the same dynamic, an internal mastery of self, despite the vicissitudes of political circumstances following the death of St Edward the Confessor and usurpation of the throne by King Harold II. Despite foreign exile in Hungary, later to flee to Scotland, she was known for her acts of mercy, and her piety. Despite the difficulties of her own life she never gave up her mastery of self, thus exercising her own queenship and free-

ing herself to serve others.

Jesus Christ has always been thought by the Church as exercising a kingly ministry, a fact emphasised by the genealogies in the Gospels, and of being son of David. From His conception Jesus had been marked out for kingship, a kingship that extended beyond the Jewish people to embrace the world, and ultimately the cosmos. This sequence known through progressive stages only makes known what was true for the beginning, that Jesus Christ is King.

Jesus' kingship, even in its cosmic proportion, never left its origin in the life of one person. The whole of reality found in the one king, Jesus Christ. This combination of whole and individual mirrors the church's understanding of conscience, of taking care of the whole by taking care of the part. It is easy to see in the light of this relationship between whole and part, of world to individual how destructive so much modern media has become. Constant attempts to disenable the individual in front of the crises of the world by so-called experts and managers are their ways of maintaining their positions of privilege and power. Once the individual is frozen out, kingship disappears because mastery of self has been replaced by group think.

Group think has cost the Church dear in all her scandals, it has cost every other profession, educational and political entity too. Exercising mastery over oneself, being your own king or queen, allows one to serve detached from ego and the need to conform needlessly to the forces of group think rather than Jesus Christ. St Margaret is a great inspiration. Wherever we are, whatever conditions in which we live, prayer to God and service to the other is always possible. Mastery of self through the gift of the Holy Spirit will allow us to offer even greater service to others.
