Peter unites: 'I don't like the hymns chosen for Mass' is an accusation that every priest has heard at least once a month in their Parish. Its good to know that someone is interested enough to complain! Though not every parishioner sings at Mass, music and song do touch the soul. Handel's Messiah or Bach's Passion of St Matthew both reflect the religious realities celebrated and shaped our understanding of those moments in the Church's year. It is almost as if I hear both Handel's music when listening to the Prophet Isaiah or Bach's violin listening to the account of Jesus walking to the Garden of Gethsemane. These great works of art have moved beyond personal taste and into the universal patrimony of humanity. Christian and non-Christian alike can share their beauty.

Most music does not of course reach such heights but may still form an identifiable cultural tradition. Such would be the great body of hymns created in this country. The hymns of John Wesley, John Henry Newman and other 19th century composers have created an artform that unites the content of our faith with memorable tunes. Singing hymns embeds deep into the heart the teaching of the Church, in much the same way as pop lyrics become fixed in the brain. Creating an 'earworm is the holy grail of the pop world. Great hymns become religious ear worms!

In recent years 'Faith and Worship' music has expanded out from its evangelical origins into the wider catholic world, itself creating another tradition of church music which derives from the world of popular singing, the guitar tradition of troubadours, folk musicians, blues and rock. This tradition of music and song is relatively young in comparison to the tradition of hymns requiring the playing of the organ. The two traditions can sit side by side, each offers its own insight into the Liturgy of the Mass unfolding celebrated every Sunday.

Tradition is key to appreciating the role of church music because tradition is the ways of doing something shared with others, that possesses its own history and contains within it the seeds of its own future development. Personal taste is perfectly acceptable in the private sphere but when it becomes public policy, it places the individual at the centre and relegates everyone else, the parish included, to an ancillary role. So personal taste cannot

become the organisational principle for any shared enterprise, nor can it become the principle for choosing music at any Parish Mass.

The Mass is a gift given to us by Jesus to make possible our sharing in His death and Resurrection. This is why Jesus desires to share the Passover with us. When He sat down to celebrate what was later called the Last Supper, Jesus ensured that the Cross would be seen as His sacrifice; the perfect form of worship; His body broken and His blood shed. Later, on that first Easter Sunday evening, when He met the two disciples on the road to Emmaus their eyes would be opened to the Resurrection. After Pentecost there was one way to see Jesus alive and that was in the Eucharist.

Pope Francis has recently released a document on the Mass, 'I deeply desire', *(Desiderio desideravi)*, quoting the words of Jesus found in St Luke's Gospel. This document explains the fruits of the Church's understanding of the Mass, as the gift to which all are called to share. This gift only becomes known when we meet Christ in the Liturgy through our shared act of worship. Pope Francis is forever warning against spiritual worldliness, that is either expressed as 'my way or no way', or the sense that living the faith is my own effort alone. The Liturgy is a gift to be shared by all.

Being shared by all requires the symbolic language of words and rituals that is the living tradition of the Church. This requires an introduction to the symbolism that marks our sacramental life, whether young or old. It is teaching children to make the sign of the Cross, genuflecting in front of the tabernacle, the prayers of Mass, singing the parts of Mass and hymns when chosen, following the rhythm of movements, standing, sitting, kneeling. All this is our contribution to the art of celebrating Mass that responds to the gift of the Mass, the privileged place to meet Jesus Christ.
