5th Sunday of Lent - 26 March 2023- Year A

In Peter writes:

Every student who studies the new Testament, and reads some texts from St John, will notice how different is the layout of Jesus' public life. Unlike in the other Gospels, Sts Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus cleanses the Temple as his first public act. It sets the scene for His public ministry. The other three Gospels have the cleansing of the Temple taking place after Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem towards the very end of His life. No one can say for certain now at what moment the cleansing of the Temple took place and its date is not a matter of faith.

The Gospel of St John describes how from within Judaism how Jesus replaces the Feasts of the Jews with Himself. After His conversation with Nicodemus explaining His mission and its mysterious origin implied in God's dealings with His chosen people, every encounter with Jesus will bring physical as well as spiritual healing: the Samaritan woman meets the Messiah as well as being reconciled with her community; the paralysed man can now walk and comes to believe in his Saviour; the manna is replaced by the Bread of Life; Jesus will be the living water, the Good Shepherd; the blind man has his physical sight restored as well as being able to see spiritually. This Sunday Lazarus will be restored back to life and the identification of Jesus with the Resurrection made explicit.

This Gospel, therefore, represents both the endpoint of our Lenten journey and the beginning of the Christian journey in the power of Holy Spirit. One might ask, though, why undertake the rigours of Lent only to celebrate an event that has already happened, and a reality that is already present.

Yes, Jesus has died for our sins on the Cross, and yes, He has risen to eternal life, thus overcoming both sin and death. These two events are the foundation on which salvation has become possible through the forgiveness of sin and reception of the Holy Spirit. The season of Lent does not negate what has been achieved for all time. Instead the season of Lent assists in making each Christian more aware of the enormity of Jesus' reconciling love in His death on the Cross, and the implications of the Resurrection for daily life. The exercises of Lent are a collective action by the Church against the sins of complacency and presumption. It is all too easy

to take God's love for granted, and fail to respond to the life-changing invitation that accepting the Gospel entails.

The request to fast, to give something pleasurable up for Lent may in its exercise, make each believer more aware of the divine presence within their life. Come Easter Sunday these rigours are put away but something precious would be lost if the lessons learnt are not put to good use elsewhere in life. Chocolate, alcohol, coffee houses may all become permissible again, and be rightly enjoyed. It is the newly rediscovered awareness of the presence of Christ that should not be lost, nor our concern with those around us. This loving presence may now touch sides of our character, those habits and individual actions antithetical to the conduct of Christian life. Likewise, the good habits of prayer, of charitable giving, of loving concern for our neighbour that might have begun, however fitfully, may in the light of Easter be continued. The Season of Lent therefore does not lose its force come Easter but in some small way has encouraged a permanent change in both our spiritual and physical life.

This legacy of Lent can be placed on a firm footing with the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is a privileged moment to cast away the sins of past life, and receiving the love which is God begin to live more fully in the power of the Holy Spirit. Then, as in the words of Pope Francis, 'one becomes credible disciples of Christ in the world' since the love Christ gives turns the Christian outward to others in order to share with others this precious gift of God's mercy. So this coming Wednesday, March 29th, at 7:30pm there will be an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the Parish Penance service with visiting priests.


