1st SUNDAY OF ADVENT - 27th NOVEMBER 2022 - Year A

It is hardly surprising that many people are feeling pro-

foundly depressed about the state of the world; climate change; war in Europe again; the country; the NHS; the job market; the rising price of energy. Not much good news on offer. Maybe it is worse now than before. There is certainly more news about than ever before but far from providing insight has created nothing other than a perennial downpour of despair.

Such a background to life can easily make us fail to see the shafts of light, the intimations of the Good News that occasionally illuminate our existence. These were called in the early Church, the seeds of the Word, the Gospel as it were hiding expectantly within the flux of our daily life. Acts of heroism, examples of wisdom, engagements with the beauty of creation and humanity, love, and friendship stand out but every day there are moments of divine light casting its rays, that both create a well of light or identify a pool of shadow. Reflecting on these seeds of the Gospel and their origin points towards something deeper still, that all creation possesses the stamp of the Word made flesh, a way that links each of us to creation. Since creation possesses this human stamp, though it is often wildly distorted through sin is always redeemable through grace. Catching hold of this dynamic, in my own life, and in my world, is the beginning of the journey of faith. Faith brings both hope and sanity to life.

Advent, the short season before Christmas is the opportune time to reflect as to where are the seeds of the Gospel active in our own lives, and where are the shadows cast by these divine rays. Intimations of grace will be turned into reality with the birth of Jesus Christ, who brings hope in Himself. What was a matter of hope will the matter of life on Christmas Eve. At one level the birth of the Christ child affects countless people who might never darken the doors of a church till this child will die and rise again on Good Friday and Easter Sunday. However, some might take this opportunity to reconnect with their faith, of undertaking once more their spiritual journey in an active and not passive way.

This is not much new in the Church. St Paul encouraged the Christian community in Rome to rediscover the ardour they possessed when they first converted. So must we in our own times. I hope this first, hopefully Covid free Christmas in three years will be an opportunity to invite back parishioners who have not returned since the end of lockdown. The reasons why they failed to return in such large numbers are academic. What matters is the living community of the Church.

Covid has accelerated the process of secularisation throughout western Europe, by cutting at the roots of community. Isolation, necessary as it was during the peaks of the pandemic, has sadly lingered in working life, in communal life and social life. Now what was taken for granted must be positively engineered or desired.

Today living in a society replete with Christian memory, of buildings, of language, of morals and customs, it has been easy to be lulled into a false sense of spiritual security. Key to this false sense of security in the idea of the perennial parish that will always be there for me, and more widely in society the Christian virtues of forbearance, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Sadly, this is no longer true. Parishes are closing throughout northern England and the tide is fast moving southwards. Often the lack of priests is cited, but the credible explanation is the collapse from within taking place in so many communities, of not feeling the need or relevance to believe. Often, I hear the sentiment expressed that there is nothing of value to assist in my life, but those types of questions give the wrong emphasis which should be on the worship of God in thankfulness for all entails. Christmas allows the best access to this worship of God, through the birth of the infant child.

Thus, Advent is our time to prepare and invite others to do the same by coming back to our Parish. This is our shared missionary endeavour and thank you for your help.
