In Peter writes: Church enters its most

This Sunday the Church enters its most solemn period when she celebrates the Litur-

gies of Holy Week, and for the second time under certain Covid restrictions. This year's account of the Passion, read on Palm Sunday, is taken from St Mark's Gospel. Each of the four accounts highlights particular aspects of the Passion. What we know as the 'full' account is an amalgam of the four different Gospel writers. I find It a joy to discover these facets because they throw light on the whole account of the Passion of Jesus and my participation in the action.

St Mark's Gospel has two unique features, firstly the sprinkling of quotes of the Our Father the account of that fateful evening in the Garden of Gethsemane. Here Jesus addresses God as Father; here He submits Himself to the Father's will; Here He tells the drowsy apostles to pray not to be put to the test. This scene is the pivot on which the whole Passion account is organised. St Mark does not relate the time that Jesus gives the 'Our Father' as a prayer to His disciples. Instead the prayer is lived out in this moment of maximum temptation. This struggle has lessons for each of us in our own struggles. Jesus is being tempted to fall away, something everyone can sympathise yet unlike us Jesus readily speaks to His Father in His humanity, but as one like us. None of us have to struggle with temptation alone, whether it being doing the bad stuff or by giving up on the vocation of life. Victory over temptation is a shared enterprise and something for which to express gratitude.

The acceptance of the Father's validates the words spoken at the Last Supper. His death will be a proper sacrifice and the Eucharist will become the new way in which Jesus Christ is present to us, 'in communion'. This new way of being with Jesus is reinforced by His three predictions that He will see them again. He will go forth to meet them in Galilee, back where it all started.

Ancient Church tradition ascribes the origin of the content of St Mark's Gospel to St Peter. Mark was the companion of Peter and took down his recollections of his life with Jesus, whilst both were in

Rome. There are many unique eye-witness and personally inspired moments in the Gospel. Two that make St Mark's Passion slightly different are two predictions of Jesus that He will be with them again. This presence would not be bodily in the normal sense but of being in communion, a deeper presence made possible by His Resurrection. Many of us feel the presence of the deceased members of our family around us, being alive in another dimension. Their presence anchors our lives, and the presence of Jesus in this way was a source of hope during the period of persecution.

he first occurs just after the woman has anointed His head much to the scandal of the apostles. However, Jesus commends her action and saying that her action will be known wherever the Gospel is preached, thus indicating that His death will be life -giving. The second occurs just before Peter declares that he would not deny Jesus and thus indicating that Peter's shortcomings will be overcome.

The following Sunday, Easter Sunday, the account of the Resurrection concludes with an open ending, 'the women came sorrowfully away' thus demonstrating that the story has not ended. We too are part of this Gospel's narrative and we too benefit from those same sources of hope found in the Passion account. Seeds of hope are found in every life, found in expressions of charity and even in moments of failure. Jesus transforms our acts of goodness for His purposes and turns our potential failures around by taking the initiative, going before us.

May I wish you all a fruitful Holy Week and a very Happy Easter.
