PENTECOST SUNDAY - 28 May 2023- Year A

## In Peter writes:

Over the last six months I have been preparing six adults to be either baptised into the Church or to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. each recipient will receive the Holy Spirit, with the rite of Confirmation being described in that liturgy as a 'personal Pentecost'. Pentecost, celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit fifty days after Easter, is always personal, tongues of fire descend onto each of those in the upper room, but the Holy Spirit remains undivided, animating the Church as a whole, turning the visible Church into a living subject. Preparation for the sacrament, too, is always personal, even when undertaken in a small group, because the teaching takes place at the personal. The desire for the sacraments makes the individual receptive to the proclamation of the Church and the teaching about the faith. Every preparation course is aimed at sustaining and developing that desire.

Presenting the material and engaging in dialogue is as fruitful for me, as I hope it may be, for the candidates. There is no better way to learn something than to tray and explain the subject. Teaching the faith reinforces may belief in the truth of the Gospel and the coherence of everything that the Church teaches. There is a thin line of personal engagement that extends from hearing the proclamation of the Gospel and the desire to receive the sacraments through to the ordered explanation of the faith. This thin line develops from personal engagement with a priest, catechist, study group into desire for lifelong learning in the faith, thus moving from priest and catechist to the most profound theology of the Church's saints.

Celebrating the Solemnity of Pentecost reinforces my understanding that the divine person of the Holy Spirit is the living heart of all that exists but which is found firstly in the Church. Jesus Christ is the Word made flesh, through whom everything was made and lives. Encountering Jesus comes first, then the explanation of all reality – a move from believing in Redemption to knowing Creation.

This is more than intellectual enquiry, of discerning the reason why there is something rather than nothing. It is the search for the living heart. Jesus yields His power through the Holy Spirit and it is personal, called grace, that the believer receives sacramentally at both Baptism and Confirmation. For those who 'work' in the Church, whether as a priest, religious sister, or parish volunteer, the institution can seem a cold and sometimes brutal, contradictory and often shambolic. There are many reasons for this; confusing faith with competence; importing alien management techniques into an essentially pastoral organisation; the chasm between the weekly orbit of parishioners compared to the diocesan wide concerns of the bishop; the misapplication of charity regulations; and laziness engendered by overfamiliarity. It is always easy to forget that the central mission of the Church is to preach the Gospel to all the nations and celebrate the sacraments. This mission is always person focused.

Looking ahead to next year, I plan to build on what has been achieved over the last few years, of providing regular moments for understanding the richness of the faith and its application to contemporary life. Sacramental courses will continue but with an added emphasis on pre-catechesis and engagement with the mission of the parish. This worked well with this year's Confirmation group engaging in different acts of service. It would be good to expand this for longer than just the duration of the course. First Holy Communion applicants will need to participate in Mass before the course starts in January by attending weekly Mass here at St Margarets and participating in the children's liturgy at the 10.30am Mass. Confirmation applicants likewise.

When the gifts of fire descended onto the apostles, they were transformed from timed individuals locked inside an upper room into bold preachers. They spoke in all the tongues of the known world but what they spoke touched the hearts of their listeners. The Holy Spirit was working in them to use words that resonated with their listeners' experience and imparted the life-changing message of the Gospel. This is the true Pentecostal church, not a denomination as such, but a church that preaches the Gospel message of liberation in a language understandable both in meaning and in content. Those first listeners asked 'what are we to do? Too often today, it seems to be, both within and without the Church 'what is the minimum I can get away with?' Pentecost is divine invitation to turn this round.


