# Fr Peter writes:

Two weeks ago, the Headmaster and a few governors of St Richard Reynolds School interviewed five candidates for the post of Lay Chaplain. Each candidate interviewed well and explained what they wished to achieve as Chaplain. What struck me afterwards was the lack of conversation about the Church as a living community and corporate body. Maybe they thought that the Church as a visible society has no traction with the eleven to eighteen-year-old age group, and so preferred to emphasise the personal relationship with God. Perhaps they just took the Church for granted, much in the same way as we can sometimes take our family for granted. Obviously, this is not a good longterm policy with regard to our family, nor is really good practise for sustaining our faith. The long-term health of both require commitment and shared vision of the future.

This Sunday the Gospel gives two beautiful images of the Church, one as the salt of the earth, and the second as the city built on a hill-top. The first image emphasises the way in which the Church through its members can potentially permeate every part of society, starting obviously at home, but also at work, and in our society at large. When Jesus spoke there was no Church, only a small community of disciples with the apostles at its heart. Their mission would be to salt the whole earth and that mission still stands, both collectively and individually. The salt of the Gospel is the salt of compassion, forgiveness and belonging, and these forms of salt bring back the taste to life, releasing what was until then hidden by sin and indifference. Just as in cooking little salt goes a long way, it does not take much to transform a situation, just a few brave souls to show a little compassion and love. These actions might be a few kind words of encouragement, a sincere offer of apology, a brave word in support of an embattled colleague.

The second image of the city built on a hill-top places the emphasis on the collective light generated by innumerable individual lights. For those of a certain age who might have gone to see Bob Dylan might remember lighting candles at 'Blowing in the wind' or similar. Mass Times & Liturgy Services

spiritual togetherness and solidarity since its inception but this light has the natural warmth of millions of individual lights that each believer carries in themselves. The Church is of divine origin, instituted by Jesus Christ Himself while personally present on earth but it is always human in scale. Therefore, the light we shine both individually and collectively does matter as it is a living part of something much larger. The season of Lent begins in just over two weeks-

time and this is opportune moment to reflect on the light, both individual and collective, that we shed in the world. What we undertake individually is a matter of personal choice, but the parish will also be undertaking some collective efforts. These efforts include the long-standing Lenten Alms Project but also two other projects of collective welcome that are explained elsewhere in the newsletter, the Landings Project for welcoming returning Catholics, and our Community Welcome project that will involve staffing two tables after the 10:30am Mass for new and recently arrived parishioners that might not know any other members of the community. This Sunday the Parish will vote and select two projects to support over Lent and a few weeks beyond into Eastertide. Please choose which project you would like to support as our collective almsgiving project. The Church was established as an act of solidarity between Jesus and His community, and maintained through the gist of the Holy Spirit. The Church still needs our act of solidarity too for it to remain the salt of the earth and light of the world.

### £80,600

The appeal total is £100,000, of which we have now raised just over 80% which is a great achievement in the time.
